One thing JetPack used to do as part of its mobile theme was to move photos to the center so that text is not immediately to the right or left of a photo, making the text very hard to read. Unfortunately, the native Academia theme doesn't do this, and, as a result, my home page is difficult to read due to the photo alignments.
