Hi André,			
Ray, the new member of the dev team, recently started committing fixes to our git repo. The auto ticket-closing seems to be working, but it seems to be doing it in my name, regardless of who committed the fix. See http://redmine.gc.cuny.edu/issues/show/526#note-32 - it was Ray who committed the fix, as can be seen here https://github.com/castiron/cac/commit/ec72020aeb5b62a39c6d66be91b6d54252f026e8			
Also, it seems like "See #" shouldn't close a ticket. According to http://redmine.gc.cuny.edu/settings , only 'fixes' and 'closes' should set as resolved.			
This is low priority - as long as things are showing up correctly on the Git end (which they are) then our history is intact.
