There appears to be a coding error that's causing the problem - I think that when the theme author migrated some custom settings to WP's built-in 'custom-header' functionality, they forgot to make the modification in one place. I've fixed it in <https://github.com/cuny-academic-commons/cac/commit/5a811ed8df9a9fdcba985b2a2ef0fed5bd827d5b>

Still, the theme has not been updated since late 2012, and is no longer publicly listed in the wordpress.org theme repository. I'm going to disable it so that it can't be activated in the future. Sites currently running the theme will be unaffected (save for the bugfix described above).
